THANKS FOR THE MEMORIES

Dear Shenandoah Region:

Many of you may not know me, but my name is Scott Grant and I live in Birmingham, AL. I am the son of Elsie Grant (now Elsie Norman) and son of the late Robert "Bob" Grant. Both of my parents were long-lasting members of AACA and the Shenandoah region; 50+ years for my mother.

As I was unpacking many of my father's antique car club memorabilia and proudly displaying it on a wall in my new garage, I was overwhelmed with emotion as I reflected upon the positive impact and influence on my life having experienced a childhood in a car club family actually had.

When Mary Lou Rissler ("Aunt Mary Lou" as the car club kids called her) passed away recently, I was awakened to the reality that the Shenandoah Regions "forefathers" of my day were now quite long in the tooth. My chances of seeing them again are either gone (as many have gone to be with the Lord) or very slight due to their longevity on this earth coupled with the vast distance between our now homes. With that being said, I wish to relay and reflect to them and the club my appreciation to the Shenandoah Region family and fraternity of automobile fanatics:

As a child, the car club was always there. I don't remember a first gathering because it had always been there, from before the time of my birth. Every adult was somehow family – I had "Uncle Bill, Aunt Gerry, Uncle Louie, Uncle Bob, Uncle Tom" and the list goes on. I ate, played and stayed at their houses not unlike my own and saw the other children as brothers and sisters; as I was an only child. Mom and Dad seemed to feel the same way about the other adults – like they had always known each other. I remember playing on Uncle Bill Sandy's rec room pool table for hours, ogling over the naked lady poster over the bar and hiding from my parents every time they said it was time to go home. The grownups often had nicknames and "fraternity" terms such as "motor-metering" (BS session) that I never understood but laughed when I heard them. Ironically, only five years ago I noticed the manufacture of the radiator thermometer on my Model-A – "Motormeter!"

The multitude of car club tours throughout VA, WV, MD and PA were a staple of my upbringing that eventually even included my wife to be. To this day, there's probably still one glow in the dark frizz bee on the roof of a motor lodge in Natural Bridge, VA – many tears for this child that day. The apple Blossom car meet was always the grand event of the year that culminated with the banquet. I remember asking my Dad what was in the brown container he always took to the banquet; He said it was "booze." I didn't know what that was and apparently I was limited to just one question.

Even if it was just a regular monthly meeting at the War Memorial Building; I remember eating great food and playing in the vacant rooms with David and Rhonda Sandy, Robert Rissler, Michael and David Stup and several others while the grown-ups had their business meeting. We always came back in for the 50-50 drawing from a big white wooden box. Hearing Louie Lamp scream "went home!" or "same ole crowd" after any ticket but his was called. The kids always took all the used tickets home in our pockets after the drawing as if they had tremendous value.

A highlight of the year was always the Fourth of July weekend campout at the Alt's farm. Campers, Bar-B-Q chicken, fireworks, minibikes, hill climb competitions and a brown jug that hung on the tree by the BBQ pit. Outside of the attention of our parents' back, we discovered that the contents of the jug tasted really bad and burned all the way down to our kneecaps. One major camping event that I'll never forget was a forest fire that occurred on the farm during the driest part of the year. A cause of the fire was

immediately pursued and although Mary Lou Ristler developed a plausible explanation of “sparks coming from one of the minibikes”; I must now admit that I had caused the disaster with fireworks; A 42 year old secret I can now hopefully lay to rest.

On a more positive note, I took my first airplane ride while at one of those campouts. John Black flew a 1940's Rearwin Sportster to the farm and landed in an adjacent field after a quick brushhogging of the landing strip to be. Wearing only tennis shoes and shorts, Robert Rissler and I took a ride with Mr. Black – I was hooked. That experience may have played a pivotal role in my life-long pursuits in aviation. As of this date, I've been a pilot for 36 years and an USAF pilot for 30 years. Mr. Black, as you probably know, is a retired United Airlines Boeing 777 Captain.

I trying to say in many words that the car club was a family that was nearly as influential to my character as my biological family. I was raised in an environment characterized by comradery, compassion and fun. Every grownup in the club at a minimum had a diverse impression on me if not playing an active role in my upbringing. It was a time without iphones, internet or video games. Back then it was dirt, pond water, minibikes, bruised knees, fires and bee stings. It was also a time with eyes-on parenting and high expectations; with the exception of the moonshine jug!

As I looked through my Dad's stack of car show plaques, I was able to recall funny stories to attach to many of them. A laugh, a tear and many memories. I found a picture from the Winchester newspaper depicting the time that Dad had become Shenandoah Region President. I remember the honor and excitement that he experienced like it was yesterday. As I looked at the picture (attached) I noticed that it was a majority of the 1970's vintage forefathers of the club – the Shenandoah Region's "Mercury 7" if you will.

Like I said earlier, time and actually life itself is slipping away from those times, memories and individuals that made them possible. Before it's too late, please hear me say, "Thank You." from the bottom of my heart to those that touched and altered to course of my life. For those that have passed on – I wish pause and afford them - in memory – the credit they deserve that I was unable to relay in person, at least in this life.

For those that are not at all familiar with me or the preceding stories and names; I'm sure the same environment is exists among the club members and their children in a similar way. Please pause and appreciate what you have and keep the spirit of a fantastic organization alive.

Shenandoah Region AACA was saddened by the news that Founding Member/ Honorary Member Dave Plank passed away March 11, 2018 in Redding, PA at the age of 91.

Services were March 16 in Birdsboro, PA. He is survived by his wife of 67 years, Betty Plank, his daughter (and with her late husband Guido Borsi, former member) Debbie Borsi, and 3 grandchildren.

Dave was a fellow who never met a stranger, and was the old-car hobby's biggest cheerleader.

Until his health began to fail, Dave was a regular at our Apple Blossom Meet, and the Christmas party, and al-

ways had great stories to enthrall us.

He literally started our club, as related on our website:

“Dave Plank arrived in Winchester in 1956 towing a Model T on his trailer. John Jackson saw this and followed Dave to his home (the old Willow Lawn Apartments, which sat near where Winchester Ford is today).

John introduced himself and handed Dave a new Model T ignition key; he had many. This started their friendship.

In 1958, John Jackson, Dave Plank, along with Shirley Bly, Bobbie Huffman,

Rufus Josey, Robert Pierce, and Earl Shade met and formed the Shenandoah Antique Auto Club.

In February 1959, we received our charter and became the Shenandoah Region of the
