It's Shenandoah Region's turn to host the Annual Corn Roast. We will have the grill fired up, and you will have your choice of ears, either grilled or kettle boiled, as you prefer. The Club will also provide butter, salt/pepper, and fried chicken as an entrée. Please bring a "covered dish" (for example: appetizer, salad, vegetable side, dessert) to share, and your own dinner plate, tableware, tablecloth and beverage.

Directions:

From Winchester, VA -- via I-81 N, take Exit 321 toward Clearbrook/Brucetown. Turn Right onto VA-672/Hopewell Rd. Proceed 0.3 miles to T-intersection at Rt. 11. Turn Right onto Martinsburg Pike/US-11 S. Proceed 0.2 miles to the Clearbrook Park parking lot entrance, on the Left. The Club Shelter is the one closest to the North end of the parking lot.

From Cumberland, MD area -- approaching Winchester, VA on US-522 South, merge onto VA-37 N via Left Ramp towards Martinsburg. VA-37 becomes Martinsburg Pike/US-11 N. Proceed 3.8 miles to the Clearbrook Park parking lot entrance, on the Right. The Club Shelter is the one closest to the North end of the parking lot.

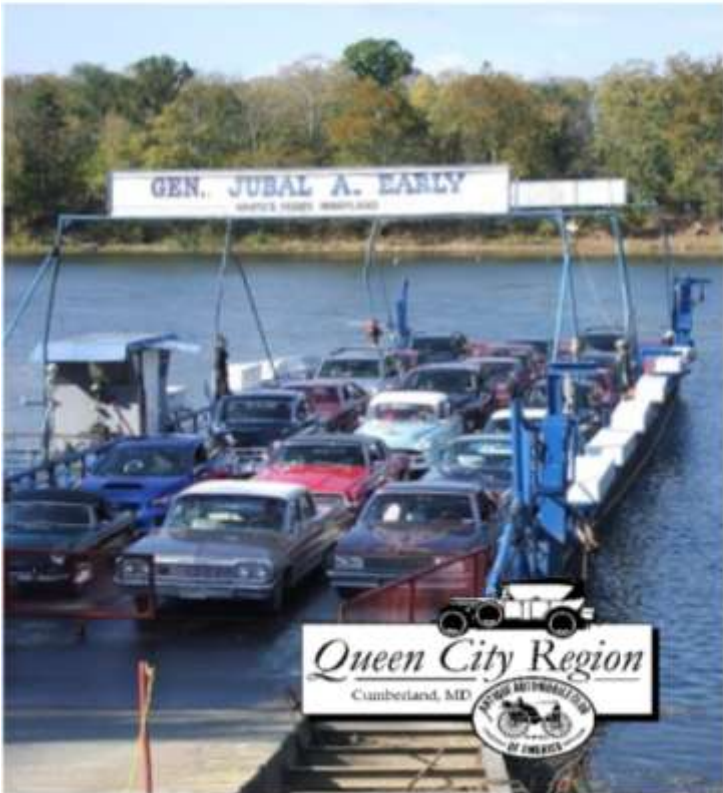
We received many good comments about our show, and hopefully we can keep improving it!

- Stock vehicles must reflect equipment available for the year and model vehicle except for minor upgrades and safety modifications. See our website for complete requirements at www.bullrunaaca.org.
- Vehicles may be displayed as the owner wishes but must fit within the space allotted and not interfere with other participants. Hoods open for judging.
- All vehicles must have a fire extinguisher
- Vehicles must be driven onto the show field under their own power
- **Once parked, vehicles must remain off & parked until the meet is over (approximately 3:15PM)**
- Cars with "For Sale" and/or "Raffle" signs must be in the Cars for Sale area
- Judging results are final
- No alcoholic beverages are permitted
- No food sales unless authorized in advance by Bull Run Region
- Registration fees are non-refundable

DIRECTIONS

From I-95: Travel I-95 to Exit 152B - Route 234 North (Manassas). Drive about 14.5 miles and make a right at the second light onto Business 234. Drive 2.5 miles and take a right at the light onto Prince William Street, (before railroad underpass) — follow signs to show entrance

From I-66 (coming from the west): Travel I-66 to Exit 44 – Prince William Parkway (Manassas). Drive about 6 miles and make a left at the light onto Business 234 (Dumfries Rd.) Go another 2.5 miles, take a right at the light onto Prince William Street, (before railroad underpass) — follow signs to show car entrance.

From I-66 (coming from the east): Take I-66 to exit 53A and follow Rte. 28 south, 7.8 miles into Manassas. Turn left onto Grant Ave. (Business 234), go under railroad overpass and left onto Prince William Street at first light. Follow sign to show car entrance.

From Prince William Parkway (Dale City / Woodbridge): At Liberia Avenue light (Parkway makes left turn) continue straight onto Wellington Rd. Go 1.3 miles to Grant Ave., and turn right. Turn right at second light onto Prince William St., follow signs to show car entrance.

Trailers: Free Parking at Osborne High School lot at intersection of Main St. and Tudor La. across from show field. Show cars must be driven from there to show entrance.
