Meeting Driving Directions

Starting just west of Winchester Medical Center, from the intersection of Route 37 and Route 50:

- ◆ Drive west on Route 50 (Northwestern Pike) for approximately 2 miles.
- ◆ **Shortly after crossing Nat'l Lutheran Boulevard**, turn left on Rte 654 (Poorhouse Road)
- ◆ At 0.2 miles, just before Round Hill Fire Station, turn right on Rte 803 (Round Hill Road).
- ◆ At 0.3 miles, turn right at rear driveway (Trinity Lane) into parking lot.

- ◆ Fellowship Hall entry is at bottom level, rear of Church, off the parking lot.

Starting driving east on Route 50:

- ◆ turn right directly into the front driveway of the Church.
- ◆ Proceed around the building to rear parking lot.

Do you know your Hupp history

I just received this note on the genealogy of the Hupp family in the Shenandoah Valley.

Thought it would be interesting since we have all traveled the very places mentioned. We never know where our automotive heritage will pop up.

Robert Craig Hupp was the founder of Hupmobile, RCH, and Hupp-Yeates Electric and his roots are in the Valley. My remarks for clarity are in parentheses.

"The R.C. Hupp family came to the Shenandoah Valley about 1720. My grandfather, Bobby Hupp, is descended from Abram Hupp who was born in New Market in 1818 and moved to Salem, VA in 1840. His oldest son was Charles Jasper Hupp, Bobby Hupp's father (Robert Craig Hupp was known as Bobby to all). Charles fought

for the south and immediately after the Civil War moved to northern Indiana, then Grand Rapids, MI (where Bobby Hupp was born), and finally to Detroit in 1884.

There is a Hupp Historic marker on Rt. 11 for the Hupp Homestead on the Northern outskirts of New Market. The Battle of New Market (May 15, 1864) was fought in part over the farm of Bobby Hupp's great-grandmother.

Bobby Hupp's uncle (his namesake) was a VMI cadet at the time of the battle but was on medical furlough. The New Market museum of the battlefield is well worth a visit.

The Hupp (Hupp's Hill Battlefield at Strasburg) battlefield also known as the Battle of Cedar Creek is on the Great Valley Pike at Strasburg on Rt. 11 and there is a museum there that relates our family connection to this historic area, as well."

For seven weeks during Nov and Dec I had the opportunity to travel and work in the Persian Gulf, specifically Abu Dhabi and Dubai in the UAE (United Arab Emirates), courtesy of the US State Department.

As most club members know I'm on retainer for the



Department and get called out periodically to work at one of our Embassies and/or Consulates overseas.

I found the UAE to be a clean, orderly, safe and exciting country that embraces the old along with the new.

Things such as camel racing, dune bashing, bedouine camps and on the other hand, the world's tallest building, the Burj Kalifa, the largest shopping mall and of interest to vehicle enthusiasts, an oversize Mercedes, oversize Dodge Pickup the worlds largest mobile caravan and the world's largest Jeep. Abu

Dhabi and Dubai also have some amazing architectural wonders.

I visited the Emirates Auto

Museum where most of these vehicles are displayed. Sheikh Hamad bin Hamdan Al Nahyan's car collection grew so large and bizarre he created a museum housed in a massive white pyramid in the desert.
