On this special day, enjoy fun family activities and the Museum Galleries for FREE from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. In addition, outdoor exhibition *Nature Connects: Art with LEGO® Bricks* will be displayed throughout the seven-acre MSV gardens! (*Nature Connects* exhibition fee applies, see www.theMSV.org for more details)



The car show begins at 10 a.m. on the lawn between the Museum and the gardens, one 10x10 canopy is allowed for shade; sorry no pets; only service animals are permitted. The car show will conclude with an awards ceremony from 2 to 3 p.m. Coffee and scrumptious bagels by Sclafani's New York Bagels & Bread will be available for purchase during check-in through morning, and gourmet sandwiches and burgers by the Roaming Bistro will be available for purchase 11 a.m.–4 p.m.!

There is no fee for registration, however pre-registration is highly recommended; the first 100 registrants will receive a free dash plaque. Vehicles in both categories must be at least 25 years old. MEET RULES:

- All vehicles must be 25 years old or older from the date of original manufacture for award eligibility
- All vehicles will be classed as Stock or Modified upon arrival by Bull Run Region and are final
- Stock vehicles must reflect equipment available for the year and model vehicle except for minor upgrades and safety modifications.
- Vehicles may be displayed as the owner wishes but must fit within the space allotted and not interfere with other participants.
- All vehicles must have a fire extinguisher and open hoods
- Vehicles must be driven onto the show field under their own power
- **Once parked, vehicles must remain turned off until the meet is over approximately 3:15 pm**
- Vehicles needing to exit earlier must be escorted off the field. Contact a Bull Run member.
- Cars with "For Sale" and/or "Raffle" signs must be in the Car Corral
- Results of the judging are final
- No alcoholic beverages are permitted
- No food sales unless authorized in advance by Bull Run Region
- Pre-registration fees are non-refundable

DIRECTIONS

From I-95: Travel I-95 to Exit 152B - Route 234 North (Manassas). Drive about 14.5 miles and make a right at the second light onto Business 234. Drive another 2.5 miles and take a right at the light onto Prince William Street, (before railroad underpass) — follow signs to show car entrance

From I-66 (coming from the west): Travel I-66 to Exit 44 - Route 234 By-Pass (Manassas). Drive about 6 miles and make a left at the light onto Business 234 (Dumfries Rd.) Go another 2.5 miles, take a right at the light onto Prince William Street, (before railroad underpass) — follow signs to show car entrance.

From I-66 (coming from the east): Take I-66 to exit 53A and follow Rte. 28 south, 7.8 miles into Manassas. Turn left onto Grant Ave. (Business 234), go under railroad overpass and left onto Prince William Street at first light. Follow sign to show car entrance.

From Prince William Parkway (Dale City / Woodbridge): At Liberia Avenue light (where Parkway makes left turn) continue straight onto Wellington Rd. Go 1.3 miles to Grant Ave., and turn right. Turn right at second light onto Prince William St.; follow signs to show car entrance.

Trailers: Parking at Osborne High School at intersection of Main St. and Tudor La. across from show field. Show cars must be driven from there to show entrance. Please contact the Show Chairman with any questions.
